The restaurant chain introduced "a part of the chicken that we somehow have not used in the last 30-some years," said CEO Joey Wat on Yum China's first-quarter earnings call. Yum China, which runs KFC and Pizza Hut in China and was spun off from Yum Brands in 2016, made the move in

Chinese poultry costs have risen as an outbreak of African Swine Fever has hit pork production, and the trade war with the US has reduced chicken imports.

The funny thing is, they tried to trace this down to the outbreak of Avian swine flu. Have they forgotten that this concerns chicken? It is a bird, not a pig. Not so good excuse to deflect what really is going on.

Wat downplayed the impact of higher poultry prices, arguing KFC could negotiate lower prices from suppliers and draw from chicken inventories. Moreover, the chain continues to explore whether new technology can provide "another way to cut out chicken," he said. It's also on the lookout for "some sort of ingredient that probably has not been used before."

Off *Bloomberg*, they came out during the earnings report and said, this sort of ingredient that has not been used before and was probably considered as a direction that KFC is going to try to raise the bottom line. If you look at the operating margin, it shrunk from 20.6% to 18.7%. In the retail market, they are going to double that, making that a minimum increase of 4%, for you and me on the street.

Poultry prices in China have risen this year due to a widespread outbreak of African Swine Fever that has hampered domestic pork production, as well as restrictions on poultry imports due to the US-China trade war, according to an industry report from Rabobank.

Speaking of the which, *YUM China Holdings* beat the earnings per share estimate. The initial estimates were 9 cents, while the actual earnings are at 12 cents. After hours of trading, they are looking at around \$38 share.

Here is the thing they are again trying to deflect, saying that paper costs, which are part of the total expenditure, have risen. Are they telling us that they did not know what the paper costs were? Try to focus on food cost. This is the typical mainstream media deflection about rising food prices.

The fried-chicken chain's same-store sales rose 5% excluding currency impacts, but its food and paper costs rose by 12%, according to its earnings report. Coupled with higher labor costs, that reduced the brand's operating profit by about 3% to \$288 million.

"We expect poultry inflation to weigh on margins for the rest of the year," said Jacky Lo, CFO of Yum China, in the earnings report.

Then in the UK *Met Office*, a few problems were encountered regarding the news of the "Hottest Easter Ever" report that was so quickly released. Now, for starters, Easter on April  $22^{nd}$  and was the  $12^{th}$  time in 208 years that it has been this late. Nice cherry pick. 


#### A FEW PROBLEMS WITH THE MET OFFICE STATEMENT, "HOTTEST EASTER MONDAY EVER!"


BRITAIN'S RECORD HOT SPRING OF 1893 — GLOBAL WARMING OR SOLAR ACTIVITY?


