
Foot of Summer Snow in BC, Hurricane Drought & Crypto Nations



Snow will be a thing of the past, *except* for this massive summer snow in British Columbia. This has happened twice now in British Columbia, and once in Alberta. That makes it three times, that it snowed in Canada during summer.

Tuesday, August 20th 2019, 8:30 am - Winter rudely interrupted summer in the west over the weekend and a round of soggy weather now follows.




Has Summer 2019 not been up to your standards as far as warmth and sunshine go? Here's a sight that might make you appreciate it a bit more.

They usually get a half centimeter, but now it is 35 centimeters. Unseasonable snow forces campers out of northern B.C. provincial park


A blast of unseasonable, snowy weather on the weekend forced the closure of one provincial park in northern British Columbia and prompted a recommendation to stay away from two others, but conditions are expected to ease soon.

A storm brought as much as 35 centimetres of snow to the Fort Nelson and Muncho Lake Park-Stone Mountain Park regions on the weekend. B.C snows more like the middle of January, but it is the middle of August.

This is a multi-day event that occurred on the 17th, 18th, and 19th.

In this week's update, NOAA weather researchers now believe there will be more Atlantic hurricanes this year than previously expected.



The hurricane season has been rather quiet. Will it last?



- * The only hurricane to form this year in the Atlantic was Barry.





Major steps to cut people's excessive calorie intake have been unveiled by Public Health England (PHE), as part of the government's strategy to cut childhood and adult obesity.

In 2021-2024, as shown in Valentina Sarkova's work, Double Dynamo in the Sun, we will start to see global food insecurity. If we follow the magnetic cancelling waves, the wider those waves get, the more exceptionally out of sync our weather becomes and growing seasons will be affected. If you have not noticed yet, the timeline matches.

The shift of our global weather patterns are set to amplify 2x from July-Dec 2017, and from 2018-2019 a 4x shift, with another jump up as the spread widens to 6x in 2019. (I explain this in detail on pages 38-41)



Steps to reduce 20% of calories in popular foods by 2024 announced to tackle childhood obesity.

The latest One You campaign aims to support people to be more calorieaware when they are out and about with its <u>simple tip 400-600-600</u>. Aim for 400 calories at breakfast, and 600 for lunch and dinner. Major high street brands are partnering with PHE on the campaign, signposting to meals that meet the 400-600-600 tip. Total daily calorie intake recommendations remain at 2,000 for women and 2,500 for men.

This is indeed, in time for the Grand Solar Minimum, where everything will be revolving around food.
